A UNIQUE TWIST ON A CLASSIC TALE

On Tuesday, Jan. 17, the 6th-12th grade classes embarked on a field trip to Belmont University's Truitt Theater to watch the Nashville Shakespeare Festival's production of *Romeo and Juliet*.

Usually performed as a traditional Medieval tragedy, this production of *Romeo and Juliet* had a bit of a unique feel. Santiago Sosa, the play's director, brilliantly managed to add a modern twist to the play while staying true to its roots of Medieval England.

Juliet, the female protagonist, was the center of these twists. In most scenes, the female star-crossed lover was seen wearing very modern attire, such as blue jeans and a traditional evening gown instead of 16th century English clothing. In the play's famous balcony scene in which the two protagonists verbally profess their love for each other, Juliet comically brushed her teeth as she spoke with Romeo. However, the meter of the play was somewhat lost, as the NSF's production made each line more like dialogue and less like poetry.
