Directions for completing the Book Report form:

1. **Name** - Write your first name and last name, using correct capitalization and punctuation.
2. **Date** - Write the date the report is due with the month spelled out, then the day and the year using digits. Use correct capitalization and punctuation. (e.g., March 24, 2023)
3. **Title** - Write the title of the book making sure to underline the full title and capitalize the appropriate words. (e.g., Charlotte's Web)
4. **Author** - Write the author's name using first name first, then the middle name, and finally last name using correct capitalization and punctuation. (e.g., E. B. White or Laura Ingalls Wilder)
5. **Pages** – Using words and digits, write the number of pages in the book. (e.g., 184 pages)
6. **Main Characters** - List the main characters in the story, tell a little about each one, and explain their part in the story. (e.g. Fern – young girl who is kind hearted. She saves Wilbur and takes care of him; Wilbur – a runt pig. He is about to be sent to the slaughter; Charlotte – a wise spider who acts like a mother to Wilbur. She spins webs to help save Wilbur's life)
7. **Setting** – List the setting of the story. The setting in a story is the **time** e.g., year, season, month, or day/night and **place** of the events in the story. If no specific dates or places are written, give the general time period and location. (e.g. “April in the 1900s in the United States” or “spring in modern times on the Arable farm”)
8. **Problem** – Describe the story problem using at least two complete sentences. A problem in a story is something that goes wrong; a problem may also be something that needs to be fixed or figured out. The problem in a story is sometimes caused by the main character. You should briefly explain the problem in the story (e.g., Wilbur is born a runt pig. When he is older, the farmer plans to slaughter him at Christmas.)
9. **Plot** – The plot of a story consists of the attempts by the characters to resolve the problem. Using several complete sentences, write the attempts made by the characters to resolve or solve the problem. Finally, give the resolution or explain how the problem was ultimately solved. (e.g. Charlotte, the spider, weaves several webs inserting the words: “Some pig”; “terrific”; “humble” and “radian”t to draw attention to Wilbur in a positive way. Charlotte's last web spun at the fair secures Wilbur a prize and a future.)
10. **Neatness** - ** Your report must be written entirely in cursive.** Complete your report neatly, making sure to use appropriate capitalization, punctuation, spelling and garmmar.
